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Susan Buttenwieser has written for a variety of publications and nonprofits including *Ms., Gotham Gazette,* City Project, and the ProChoice Resource Center. Her fiction has been nominated for a Pushcart Prize and she teaches a writing workshop in the youth program at the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Community Center and has worked with several other LGBT youth organizations.

She is also a parent, a family therapist, and an activist for Parkinson's research-funding. Her articles about teaching and her poems and translations have been published in a variety of books and journals, including "Rethinking Schools," She has an article, "Helping Our Children Cope: Educating Without Traumatizing" in a new book addressed to teaching about issues of war and peace entitled, *Nurturing the Peacemakers in Our Students*, published by Heineman Press.
